Does Corporate Responsibility pay off?

A 2010 study by the Vienna University of Economics and Business tried to determine a link between effective CSR strategies and their impact on industrial competitiveness.

The study carried out by Professors André Martinuzzi, Sabine Gisch-Boie and Adele Wiman highlighted interesting outcomes:

- CSR strategies and competitiveness links depend on sector and sub-sector specific conditions;
- CSR strategies and action plans need to be broadly disseminated and acknowledge at all organizational levels;
- At Industry level, transversal stakeholder involvement is crucial to ensure involvement of multiple organizational layers (i.e. business associations, NGOs, trade unions)

The study is provides an interesting overview for organizations seeking to implement effective CSR strategies that can have a meaningful internal impact.

The report will be an interesting tool to be considered by the CSR-MATRIX partnership!
